Parent Service and Family Diversity

Parent Service

The success of St. Matthew School is largely related to the generous participation of the families in the life of the school. Family volunteers dedicate their time in a verity of ways to support the school. In early October each year, our families help organize a Fall Fiesta. This is a day of fun, games, food, and fundraising. This event raised \$5,000.00 for our school.

Parents also have a large role in our Spring Event Celebrate 2 Educate. A Fiesta under the stars. They help setup, cook, serve and clean up. This event raised \$7,500.00 this May. Some of our families also volunteer at the school to help with everything from office work to assisting as aids in our class rooms. Over the past year, our parents volunteered over 3,600 hours to the school.

Continuing to build and enrich relationships and community with our families, we offer a variety of services to assist them where there is need.

Family Diversity

Our school operates under the historical assumption that Catholic Schools were founded in the United States during the 19th century by such greats as Mother Seton and Mother Drexel to educate the children of immigrants and minorities. St. Matthew School' families are representative of both groups. The majority of our families are those whose parents and grandparents were born in Mexico, or are recently arrived from Mexico. The average in- come at St. Matthew School for a family of 4 is \$24,000 per year. Because of this, 99.9% of our students receive reduced or free Federal breakfast and lunch.

The school itself is 51% male and 49% female. 47% of the household speak Spanish only while 38% speak English only at home. 15% are bi-lingual. 99% of the student body are Catholic. 51% of the students go home to both parents. 46% go home to a single parent. 3% go home to a non parental guardian. 87% of the student body are from the immediate school area while 13% drive in from up to 27 miles away.



Curriculum

A Dual Language Program is an educational program that instructs students in two languages. St. Matthew School introduced Dual Language Instruction in Kindergarten and First Grade for 2009-2010, and in 2010-2013 in Kindergarten through Second Grade-based on the program at and in collaboration with Desert Willow Elementary School in the Cave Creek Unified School District. In St. Matthew's program, Language Arts (English), Social Studies, Religion, Physical Education, and Computers are taught in English and Mathematics, Science, and Language Arts are taught in Spanish.

The purpose of the program is to encourage our students to achieve high levels of proficiency in a second language without detrimental effects to their primary language development. Studies show that they perform better on tasks that call for divergent thinking, pattern recognition, and problem solving, and develop advanced levels of linguistic awareness. Studies further prove that their ability to reason and to perform higher level thinking is enhanced by understanding two languages simultaneously. Since most social interactions are by choice, the motivation to understand is so strong it encourages student learning. By interacting with peers who are fluent in the target language, monolingual children become proficient in a short period of time. Proficiency in two languages also permits individuals to expand their world. We look forward to expanding the program into Third Grade in 2013-2014 and to Fourth Grade by 2015.

The Dual Language program was also selected as one of twelve Catholic schools nationwide to participate in a pilot program to implement multi-lingual instruction in Catholic Schools. The program is co-sponsored by the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA) and Boston College. The program will sponsor a weeklong workshop in Boston for five of the eight member team as well as sponsor a mentor who will work with the school for the next two years to hone the program into further excellence. We are pleased that Ms Cristina Ladas, the founder of the program at Desert Willow has agreed to step into this role, in order to take our program "to the next level".


The 2008-2009 accreditation recommended that St Matthew School improve its methods for assessing and measuring student learning. In addition to the Iowa Test of Basic Skills administered in September, students are given "benchmark" exams at the beginning of the year and then again in May. During this past school year, teachers have also attended intensive training in The Common Core Standards taught by Dr. Melissa Castillo and members of her team. The school anticipates fully transitioning to instruction based on these standards by 2015.

All teachers are formally and informally observed throughout the year and our number one School-wide learning expectation continues to be that students become *Active Catholics*. As such, maintaining an ongoing sense of our Catholic identity is our foremost priority and this past year expressed itself by reviewing all of the social teachings of the Catholic Church thereby giving the students a sense of themselves as responsible for the world and their brothers and sisters who inhabit it.

Poverty damages children's dispositions and blunts their brains. We have seen articles about the language deficit in poor homes and the gaps in school achievement. These remind us that poverty is now likely to define many children's trajectories in the harshest way: Poor academic achievement, high dropout rates, and a variety of health issues.

Our plan at St. Matthew's is to better equip and communicate with students and parents in the 21st century so as to close the gap that exists between rich and poor schools. The majority of our students live at or below the poverty level. However, this should not inhibit them to achieve their full potential. With our **Apples4Angels**, we will support them in their success in our ever growing technological age. At St. Matthew School we have developed a three year plan ,with your financial assistance, will help us to close the gap.

One way we are asking you to assist us, is through the gradual implementation of iPads for our faculty and student body. Arguments can be made about the expense of such an endeavor. However, with the sales of desk top and lap top computers on the decline, and the sales of tablets, iPads and smart phones on the increase, it has become apparent that the market, the way we learn, and the way we retrieve/communicate information is changing. The fundamentals of key boarding and typing are still important, but the access to current information, when and where students need is ever increasing in importance.

How does all of this impact the students at St. Matthew's?

High Schools both public and private are moving to technology in the class room. This means that teachers have to possess both the skills to use the technology and how to implement or integrate it into the classroom. It also means our students must learn to utilize the tools and power of an iPad to attain levels of competence at the high school level and beyond.

An annual survey conducted at St. Matthew's School for the past 7 years, asked students about their technology at home. The survey revealed several important facts: 1) Home computers are in 77% of our students homes. That compares to 48% just 4 years earlier. 2) Smart phone are in 56% of homes versus 39% three years earlier. 3) Tablet's and iPad's are in 41% of homes as opposed to three years earlier at 18%. 4) Home internet is in 63% of homes up from 24% four years ago. These results indicate that mobile devices are on the rise as is internet installation in the home.

Given the socioeconomic base of St. Matthew, (families of four average incomes are \$24,900), it is an educational imperative to equip our students with the technology and skills of the 21st Century. We would be remiss in not providing the same opportunities availed to students of wealthier schools. Our students must have the skills to work beside other students with the same technological skills.
